**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Continuing development of speaking, reading, writing, and listening, emphasizing conversational and reading skills. Designed for students who have completed Intermediate Japanese I. Additional Kanji and grammar structures are introduced. Also includes aspects of Japanese culture.

**COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

Continued improvement of conversational skills, memorization of additional Kanji, improvement of reading skills and continued learning of advanced grammatical syntax.
